
Indirect Speech: Backshift of Tenses



will-future → conditional I: $can \rightarrow could$:

may \rightarrow might:

conditional I → keine Änderung: could / might → keine Änderung:

that year

"I will leave school at the end of the year." >

"I hope I *can* get a job at a bank." \rightarrow

"Finding work may be difficult." \rightarrow

"I wouldn't give up tennis." >

"I *could* come to your party, but I don't want to!"

He said that finding work *might* be difficult.

He said that he wouldn't give up tennis.

He said that he *could* come to my party but he didn't want to.

today → that day tonight \rightarrow that night this week \rightarrow that week this year \rightarrow

yesterday → the day before last Friday → the Friday **before** last month \rightarrow the month **before** two days **ago** → two days **before**

tomorrow \rightarrow the next day / the following day next year → the next year / the following year
